with our “Clean Energy Leadership” Award. On March 29, 2005, the City of Worcester became the first city in Massachusetts to set a goal of using clean, renewable energy sources to meet 20% of its municipal electricity needs by 2010. On that day, the City Council unanimously adopted the “20 Percent by 2010 Clean Energy Resolution,” which called for greater use of electricity generated from clean sources of power, such as wind, solar, low-impact hydro, and biomass, instead of electricity generated from coal, oil, gas and nuclear power. To date, the City of Worcester is also the largest city in the United States to pass such a resolution. Thank you for setting a powerful example of environmental stewardship for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
