with our “Green Municipality” Award. The City of Newton has made itself an environmental leader among cities in the Commonwealth and has lived up to its billing as “The Garden City”. In recent years, the City of Newton joined the U.S. Department of Energy's Million Solar Roofs Partnership, pledging to create 500 new solar projects by adding solar systems to public buildings and promoting the use of solar energy by private organizations and citizens in Newton (the “Sunergy Project”). The City of Newton also launched a Web site to help Newton residents reuse items they do not need by giving, selling or trading them to others. The City has made efforts to preserve open space and has written its own Climate Action Plan. Finally, the City has agreed to purchase clean electricity (renewable energy certificates) generated by wind turbines in Massachusetts. Thank you, City of Newton, for your environmental leadership.
